By the end of Key Stage 1 we hope that all children will:

- Be developing strategies for independent learning
- Value each other and each others' work
- Be able to remain on task, showing sustained levels of concentration
- Be able to work cooperatively, listening and taking turns and making contributions
- Be happy and secure, growing in self-confidence
- Be able to ask for help
- Be able to give and receive praise

- Have developed self-help skills
- Know what is expected of them
- Be well motivated to learn
- Take pride in their work

An Effective Learner at the end of KS2

By the end of Key Stage 2 we hope that all children will:

- Be active participants in the learning process, seeing themselves as learners
- Take responsibility for their own actions and learning
- Be inquisitive, self-motivated and responsive
- Be resourceful and have good organisational skills
- Be able to work cooperatively, interacting with others and working equally well in different groupings
- Be confident and happy with high levels of self esteem
- Be socially and spiritually aware, able to look beyond themselves
- Be able to self-evaluate and peer-evaluate
- Be able to celebrate their own gifts and talents and those of others
